## Monday & Tuesday March 4 & 5

**STORY:** "Baa, Baa Black Sheep" Nursery Rhyme Big Book

**PROJECT:** "Baa, Baa Black Sheep" Glue cotton balls to a black sheep shape

**LEARNING TIME:** "Sheep Sort" Sort black and white sheep in appropriate pens

**MOTOR:** "Bag of Shapes" Children take turns to jump on matching shape colors



## Wednesday, March 6

**STORY:** "Reach Out and Give" by Cheri J. Meiners

**PROJECT:** "Candy Bar Covers" Peel back stickers to place on candy covers for community helpers

**LEARNING TIME:** "Snip Grass" Snip grass for sheep

**MOTOR:** "Scarf Movement" Follow directional movements using music cd
